

#### **International Dinner is April 25 at Frankfort Country Club**

22nd annual International Dinner on Thursday, April 25, beginning with a social hour and silent auction at 6 p.m. at the Frankfort Country Club, 101 Duntreath, Frankfort; dinner and program will begin at 7 p.m.

The guest speaker will be Mr. Eric Gregory, president of the Kentucky Distillers'Association, a veteran communicator with over 25 years of experience in governmental affairs, marketing, journalism and strategic public relations. His topic will be "Kentucky: Bourbon Capital of the World."

Mr. Gregory said, "The positive impact of the bourbon industry on the state is incredible. For example, our statistics show, Kentucky is the birthplace of bourbon, crafting 95 percent of the world's supply; Kentucky holds more than a third of all distilling jobs in the U.S., boasting an average salary of \$95,000; Bourbon is an \$8.6 billion signature industry in Kentucky, generating 20,100 jobs with an annual payroll

The Rotary Club of Frankfort will host its of \$1 billion; bourbon tourists made a record 1.4 million stops to Kentucky distilleries in 2018; and Kentucky exported over \$450 million of whiskey in 2017 — an export value which has tripled in the past 20 years."
