Next Week's Speaker...

Betsy Hatfield is the Executive Director of Preservation Kentucky. She is a nonprofit administrator with more than 37 years of executive leadership experience with public charities and government, and more than 15 years of historic preservation experience, including serving as the executive director of Preservation Alliance of Louisville and Jefferson County and the historic preservation coordinator for the Kentucky Division of Historic Properties.

Betsy's historic preservation work includes extensive experience organizing and managing restoration and conservation projects at the Kentucky State Capitol, Executive Governor's Mansion, state-owned historic properties and house museums throughout the Commonwealth; developing an income producing heritage tourism program; and, serving as a team member on various community preservation projects such as AIA design charrettes, public-private partnerships, building reuse viability studies

and strategic planning for neighborhood revitalization. Her technical experience also includes the preparation of Federal Historic Preservation Tax Credit applications; Section 106 Review assessments; environmental impact reviews of preservation districts; participation in historic district design overlay reviews; and, testifying at public hearings for economic development and preservation issues.

Betsy's nonprofit leadership experience includes fundraising for nationally affiliated and local charities with annual budgets of more than \$27.4 million; overseeing assets of \$223 million; organizing special events that generated more than \$1 million annually; securing grants that generated more than \$5 million annually; and, securing major gifts of up to \$20 million. Her expertise includes strategic planning; the development of diversified annual and long-term income; capital campaigns; board development; and donor stewardship. Her public relations experience includes serving as a public information officer for the City of Louisville; a speech writer and event organizer for two Louisville mayors; a special assistant to then Louisville Mayor Jerry Abramson, and a press secretary for a U.S. Senate nominee.

Betsy has a Bachelor of Arts degree in Art History & Aesthetics and Studio Arts with minors in Music and English from Mars Hill College (North Carolina); and three semesters of degree work toward a Masters of Divinity from Southern Seminary (Louisville).

Throughout her career, Betsy has championed a variety of causes, including historic preservation; heritage tourism; public policy; children's services and after-school programs; youth development; job skills training; poverty prevention; healthcare; and access for persons with disabilities. She has served on numerous nonprofit boards, volunteered for a variety of community causes, and received numerous honors and awards for her work.
