Juneteenth

June 19 is observed by many of our fellow citizens as Juneteenth, the oldest national commemoration of the end of slavery in America. Juneteenth traces its roots to June 19, 1865, when Major General Gordon Granger landed in Galveston, Texas and declared that the Civil War was over and enslaved people were now free.

Texas was the first state in the country to declare Juneteenth as an official holiday and today many other states and cities have started to recognize its significance as well and to make plans to recognize and celebrate Juneteenth and its message of freedom.

"A Minute With..."

Look for a new special online feature called, "A Minute With..." As part of the board's efforts to keep us connected, member Dustin Cole will be using our Zoom conferencing app to help us know our fellow members better, and perhaps preserve some of our history.
