Board Action July 21, 2021

Attending: Diane Dehoney, John Avent, Tish Shade, Carol Smith, Gordon Saks, Mary Saks, Bill Miller, Chuck Dickinson, Bill Scott, Lee Troutwine, Dudley Ellis and Paula Rarden.

- Approved the minutes of the June 16, 2021 board meeting. John Avent made the motion, second by Tish Shade.
- Listened to June 2021 financial report from John Avent.

- Discussed the preliminary proposed budget for the 2021-22 year. Revisions to be made by John Avent and brought back to the board for vote in August 2021 board meeting.
- Approved new members Kelly Anderson, Chris Thompson, and Jason Miller contingent upon no negative response after publication in the newsletter. John Avent made the motion, second by Gordon Saks.
- International Service Director Bill Miller discussed 1) major webinar with RI and the Peace Corps on Sept. 20; 2) Miller will chair District Intl. Services Com. in 2020-21; 3) board members will receive a video of an interesting international project in Guatemala to be discussed at August meeting.
- Club Service Director Tish Shade acknowledged that she has the greeter and opening exercises for the next few months covered.
- Sergeant-at-Arms Chuck Dickinson reported that he needs cords and the instruction manual for the new screen and projector the club has thanks to the generous donation of fellow Rotarian Dave Weller.
- President Diane noted that the last date for filing grants will be 8/31/21.

- President Diane reported that she will be working with Kristin Cantrell on getting our club involved with the Mission Clinic. We partnered with the Franklin County Community Fund on a district grant to support a local mission clinic that provides medical, dental, and pharmaceutical services to uninsured area residents and to the local immigrant population free of charge. Our grant purchased supplies and medicine for the clinic. Because of the pandemic, we were unable to do any hands-on volunteering last year, but we hope to do so soon.
- Rotary Youth Fund President Bill Scott reported that they handed out 11 local scholarships totaling around \$20,000. This included ones from Burch Dental and the Frankfort Plant Board.
- President Diane reported that our club reached STAR status this year, so we are eligible for grants.
- President Diane also noted that our club will continue using Facebook until Cable 10 has their equipment so we can record the weekly meetings.
- Scheduled the next board meeting for August 18, 2021.
