Board Action March 16, 2022

Attending: Diane Dehoney, John Avent, Dustin Cole, Gordon Saks, Donna Hecker, Chuck Dickinson, Mary Saks, Lee Troutwine, Dudley Ellis, and Paula Rarden.

- Approved the minutes of the 2/23/22 board meeting with an update to the following minutes: First, the board requests that each Rotarian voluntarily donate \$25 or more to help raise the \$1,500 for our Polio plus commitment; second, the \$500 appropriation for an international project will be forwarded to the 2022-23 budget, with a goal of adding another \$500 for a total of \$1,000 for a donation next year. Bill Miller made the motion, second by John Avent.
- Listened to financial report for February 2022 as presented by John Avent.
- International Service Director Bill Miller reported via email: "The Frankfort Rotary Club Board voted to not hold the International

Dinner on April 28. Instead, there will be a special program at noon on Wednesday, April 27 at the Capital Plaza Hotel. Also, we will have a Silent Auction to help raise the \$1,500 for our Polio plus commitment. Additionally, the board voted to request that each Rotarian make a voluntary contribution of \$25 to expand our total. Please be sure and check your attics and basements to locate any items for the Silent Auction."

- Public Relations Director Donna Hecker reported that our club's speech contestant winner is scheduled to speak at Rotary Sectional on 4/22/22. Donna also that she was going to be getting the Tim Pennington to possibly update the club's webpage.
- Program Chair Gary Stratton reported that he has speakers scheduled through April.
- Gary Stratton noted that President Diane and he would be getting together material to be handed out at our 3/30/22 club assembly for the "Radio Days Fundraiser."
