Polio Plus Reminder

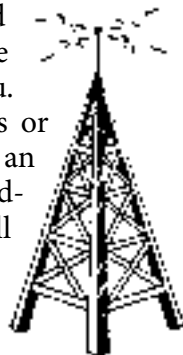
