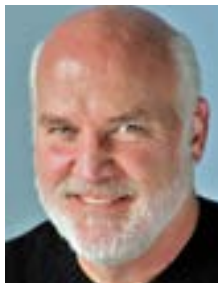

- Approved motion for the club to submit two grants for the 2022-23 year. First grant in the amount of \$1,200 for scholarship money, and another for \$3,000 for Thornhill Playground Project. John Avent made the motion, second by Bill Miller.
- Past President Diane Dehoney discussed with the board about a pilot "Dictionary Project" for our club to start up. A committee is working on the cost and visibility for the project.

- President Dustin reported that there will be an Annual Picnic on Oct. 9, 2022 at Lee Troutwine's farm. The club will provide the chicken and a sign-up sheet will be passed around for potluck items.
- International Service Director, Bill Miller reported 1) Rotary Club of Goma is working to be certified to become a partner in a clean water project; 2) The statewide United Nations Day program, of which District 6710, Frankfort and Louisville Rotaries are co-sponsors, is scheduled via Zoom on Oct. 25; 3) The Rotary-Peace Corps Partnering for Peace project is moving forward in Kentucky; 4) UN Day display is set up near the Governor's Office in the Capitol.
