El Salvador Update

The El Salvador Water Project in Jayaque is nearing completion. Our club has contributed to this international project in the past. Rick Harned, District 6710 International Service Committee Chair with the Rotary Club of Louisville, says...

"The water is flowing from the well we helped drill in Las Graditas, Jayaque, El Salvador!"



"Here are some photos of the completed storage tank (with Rotary credits) and the walls the community has built to help divert flood waters from the pump house. We now need to talk with the local health center and the school to see if they have noticed improvement in the community health and school attendance.

"Tito has reported having some unused funds from the grant. He is checking with the community about installing solar panels to help reduce electricity costs (the electricity comes from the near-by town).

"Tito also has another well-drilling project ready to go. Let me know if your club can consider supporting it! I'll send full information or help you contact Tito.

"Tito is now the District Governor for District 4240, and has scheduled the next Project Fair for January 20-22, 2023. Several Kentuckians will be attending – it you'd like more information let me know."
