Next Week's Meeting...

July 19, 2023

Change in meeting place – Our club will be meeting at the American Legion on Versailles Rd next week (June 23) and the following 3 weeks.

Local historian, preservationist, and Frankfort native **John Carlton** is currently employed as an environmental scientist with the Kentucky Department for Environmental Protection. John has worked in public policy for state government for over a decade in several capacities includ-

ing environmental policy analyst, paralegal, grants administrator, and administrative support. John graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Music from Kentucky State University in 2007 where he served in several leadership roles.

Later, John recruited and worked with the ACLU-KY, Kentucky Commission on Human Rights, and other civil rights organizations to create and pass the 2013 Fairness Ordinance which established the local human rights com-

mission and made Frankfort just the fifth city in the commonwealth at the time to extend basic civil rights protections on the basis of sexual orientation and gender identity. Today, Kentucky now has 24 municipalities with Fairness Ordinances that collectively cover over half of Kentucky's population.

More recently, John was instrumental in the 2020 creation of Frankfort's first historic preservation officer position. He currently serves as vice president of Envision Franklin County, is co-creator and organizer of Frankfort Heritage Week and its heritage tourism coalition, is at-large citizen appointee to the current Frankfort-Franklin County Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee, and was the 2021 president of the Franklin County Trust for Historic Preservation. For fun, John enjoys cooking, gardening, music, reading about local history, and playing with his beloved dog and cat, Sassy and Moonpie, at his home in Switzer.
