Christian radio broadcaster **Greg Horn** is best known as an encourager, coach, motivator, and speaker. He speaks regularly to organizations, civic groups and churches on the topics of fear, gratitude, and hope. He also hosts the radio show and podcast, HOPE is Here, that broadcasts daily, Monday through Friday on multiple radio stations in Central Kentucky. Greg has also been a guest on various television/radio programs and podcasts.

HOPE is Here began in December 2017 from a holy discontent that was growing in the heart of founder, Greg Horn. It has broadened its scope to include community

involvement, community assistance, counseling and mentoring. Having suffered his own suicidal thoughts in 2001 after a series of tragic events and losing three friends to suicide, Greg felt strongly that he was being called to make a difference. HOPE is Here Ministries was birthed from a desire to shed light on the taboo subject of suicide and to offer hope and encouragement to people who are struggling with mental health. It has broadened its scope to include community involvement, community assistance, counseling and mentoring.

## Rotary Peace License Plate is now available in Kentucky!

**WHAT:** A group of Rotarians committed to our purpose of Promoting Peace have developed a new Rotary Peace Plate license tag that is available for ALL KENTUCKIANS. Net proceeds of the sale of this plate in our 72 counties goes directly to our District 6710 Disaster Relief Fund.

**WHY:** Kentucky has had more than its share of natural disasters. This fund was created to help us be prepared and more quickly assist communities when disaster strikes. This Rotary Peace Plate initiative helps supplement our contributions while spreading the powerful message of PEACE.

**HOW:** Contact your county clerk to let them know you wish to obtain the new "Promoting Peace" plate. Due to limited storage, some county clerks will not order plates until they know there is a demand. \*

You don't have to wait, renew your plate TODAY! Use the QR code on the back page to order online.

**WHEN:** Before the end of 2025.

**GOAL:** The goal is to have 500 plate subscriptions, as soon as possible. While each plate pays a donation on initial registration and all renewals, Kentucky pays the lump sum at the end of a calendar year ONLY AFTER 500 plates have been reached. So, to get a payment in early 2026, we need to reach 500 by the end of 2025.
