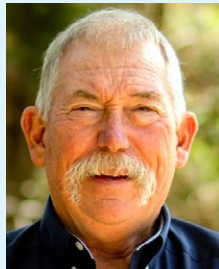

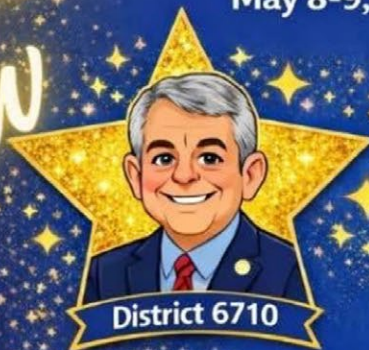
- Invite a local health care worker to speak at your club about the importance of vaccinations.
